Services: individual or youth emergency shelter referrals, rental assistance for individuals (families without minors). Families with minor children experiencing unsheltered homelessness must call 211's Homeless Helpline to be assessed for the mainstream shelter waitlist. Immediate placement is not guaranteed, and wait times vary.

Homeless Leadership Alliance (HLA) – referrals are required (211)

Eligibility: Families with legal custody of children under the age of 18 and individuals who are currently experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness.

Provides: assistance with finding housing and housing placement process. **Cannot** assist with motel funds nor Emergency Housing Vouchers. Shelter; meals; case-management; Family Day Center with internet access, guest phone, laundry and showers; transportation assistance; access to additional community resources, translation services, and connection to mental health services for veterans.

Homeless Empowerment Program (HEP) - referrals are required (211)

Eligibility: individuals and families; no sex offenders; must be able to care for self.

Note: referrals needed. Non-veterans need to go through Homeless Outreach for 30 day beds, veterans need to go through Bay Pines VA for 90 day beds.

Provides: emergency shelter for thirty days, transitional and permanent housing. For individuals, referral is needed from Outreach and for families need to call 211 for shelter placement, case management, and access to multiple supportive services.

Additional services: meals, hygiene items, dental, transportation assistance, medical and mental health counseling, case management (all for current clients only), child care, summer camp and before/after school activities, assistance with food stamps, Medicaid, benefits assistance, CHAP program assists with move-in costs. The case manager works with the client on self-sufficiency and helps with referrals for other agencies better suited to their needs.

Eligibility: Families, single women, single men; ID required.

Provides: emergency center which is opened 7 days; when available, beds are given out at 9AM on a first come, first serve basis. There are a family dorm, all-female dorm and all-male dorm; three meals are served each day; case management and access to resources after 10 days; computer access for job searches. Individuals who do not want to participate in the programs can still get a bed, meals, and showers for 30 consecutive days. First 90 days are free, the maximum stay is 8 months.

Eligibility for residential program: homeless pregnant women 18 and up (exceptions made for minors), with no children or one child under 9 months of age; must be 6 months clean and sober; adults must be in school and/or working twenty hours/week-full time. Adult doesn't have to be employed full time at the time of application. Must be able to pass a level 2 background check, no felonies.

Provides: residential housing for 9-18 months, counseling, case management, life skills education (budgeting, parenting, housing, nutrition, substance abuse prevention), as well as maternity/infant supplies (baby clothes, formula, and diapers, sometimes also strollers and other things on a first come first serve basis).

Note: for baby supplies, any mother can call (can receive assistance every 60 days for clothing and every 30 for diapers and food).

Must have been sober for 9 months. No violent background at all.

Provides: transitional housing for up to six months after the baby is born. Women may apply for 3 month extensions for up to 24 months total of housing services. If there is any Child Protective Services involvement, must have paperwork and do check/ screening for child abuse.

Services: modest fees for a long term transitional housing with case management (furnished apartment, one to three years), life skills classes, one-year self-sufficiency program, access referrals for counseling, job training, and education opportunities, as well as tutoring for minor children.
